BENEFICE

Our rural young people deserve the same opportunities as young people in urban communities! – A reflection by the Vicar.

Following the pandemic, the National Youth Agency commissioned a report to examine youth provision in local areas. The report made it clear that there are vast gaps in local youth services, with 2.2 million young people, living in predominantly rural areas, consistently overlooked. The National Youth Agency says that there is little or no co-ordinated provision in many rural areas to tackle inequalities and put young people at the heart of the coronavirus recovery. The amount spent per head on youth work for 11- to 19-year-olds in rural England, £47, is 25 per cent less than in urban areas, and half the level of a decade ago.

Young people, growing up in rural areas, often suffer from feelings of isolation, imposed not just by distance from school friends, but also because of a deficit in ways to build connections – there may well be no public transport, poor or non-existent mobile signal and poor Wifi connectivity. All of this puts our rural youngsters at risk of poor mental health but also makes them vulnerable to County Lines gangs that, in some parts of our Diocese, already target rural youth. Furthermore, we see few of them in our churches and there are few opportunities for us to help them to walk the path of Christ, as fellow disciples.

All of this has been weighing heavily upon the minds of the clergy serving in our rural deanery of Tunstall but we have a solution, we just need some support to make it a reality! Blackburn Diocese are running a scheme called 'Ignite', which will initially fund Youth Workers 100% in the first year with funding gradually being reduced over the 5 years that follow. Tunstall Deanery are putting together a bid for 2 Youth Workers to be employed to work across the Deanery, creating and equipping hubs in rural areas where young people can be brought together safely to share fellowship and fun. In order for our bid to be successful, we need to find funding to support the future years of the project and that is where we need your help!

Perhaps you're a regular churchgoer or perhaps you are just someone who wants to see our rural youth given the same opportunities as their urban neighbours {it's a matter of fairness and justice for me!} If you care passionately about the future for our young people and feel able to donate to support our bid for 2 Youth Workers then please email me for further details: revcinders@gmail.com. Emergency Appeal

I am writing to ask for your urgent support in addressing a humanitarian crisis that has broken out in our link Diocese of Liwolo in South Sudan. Late on Tuesday evening, parts of the Diocese were attacked by Ugandan troops in the most serious of a number of border incursions. As a result of this attack and the continuing presence of Ugandan troops, 10,000 people have been internally displaced. With no effective government response, they have taken refuge in the compound of Liwolo Cathedral. We have been working with Christian Aid to co-ordinate a response with their partners, the South Sudanese Development and Relief Agency ([SSUDRA: Humanitarian Aid in South Sudan | ssudra](http://ssudra.org)). Already, aid supplies are starting to flow because of an emergency grant from this Diocese. But a great deal more is required.

I am writing in the hope that you and the people you serve might be able to make an immediate donation to the fund. All moneys given will be used at once to alleviate suffering in the Cathedral Compound where people have access to water but not to food, blankets, tents or medical supplies.
